U.S. Tariffs Contribute to Housing Prices

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U.S. TARIFFS CONTRIBUTE TO HOUSING PRICES

The average tariff rate Americans pay for products commonly used to build new homes jumped from 1.67 percent in 2017 to 7.70 percent in 2021 - more than a fourfold increase. Tariffs are essentially a sales tax on imports, so U.S. tariffs on products from China are increasing Americans' costs on a variety of products, including new homes. This infographic lists a sampling of tariffs' impacts on costs for common housing supplies.

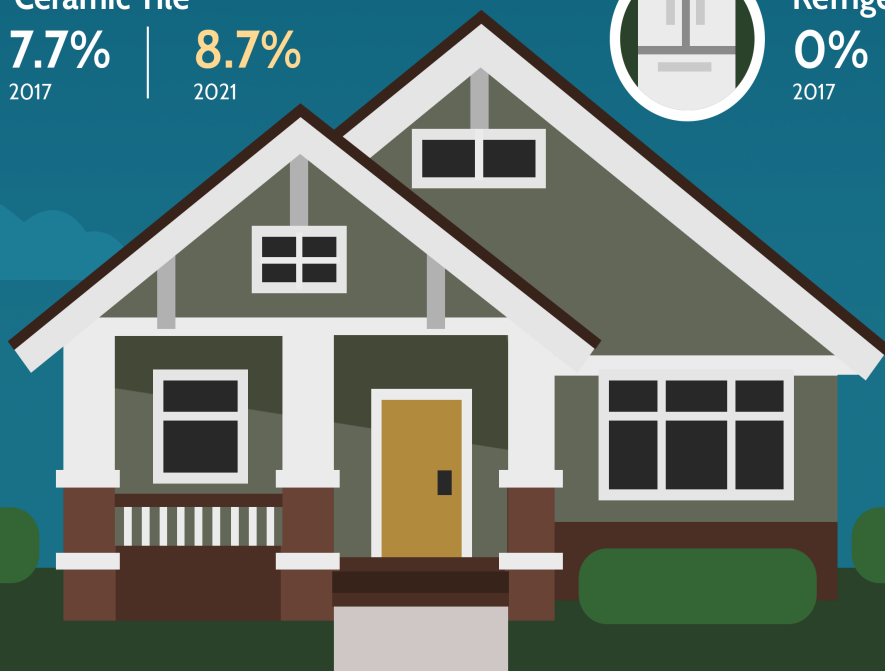
