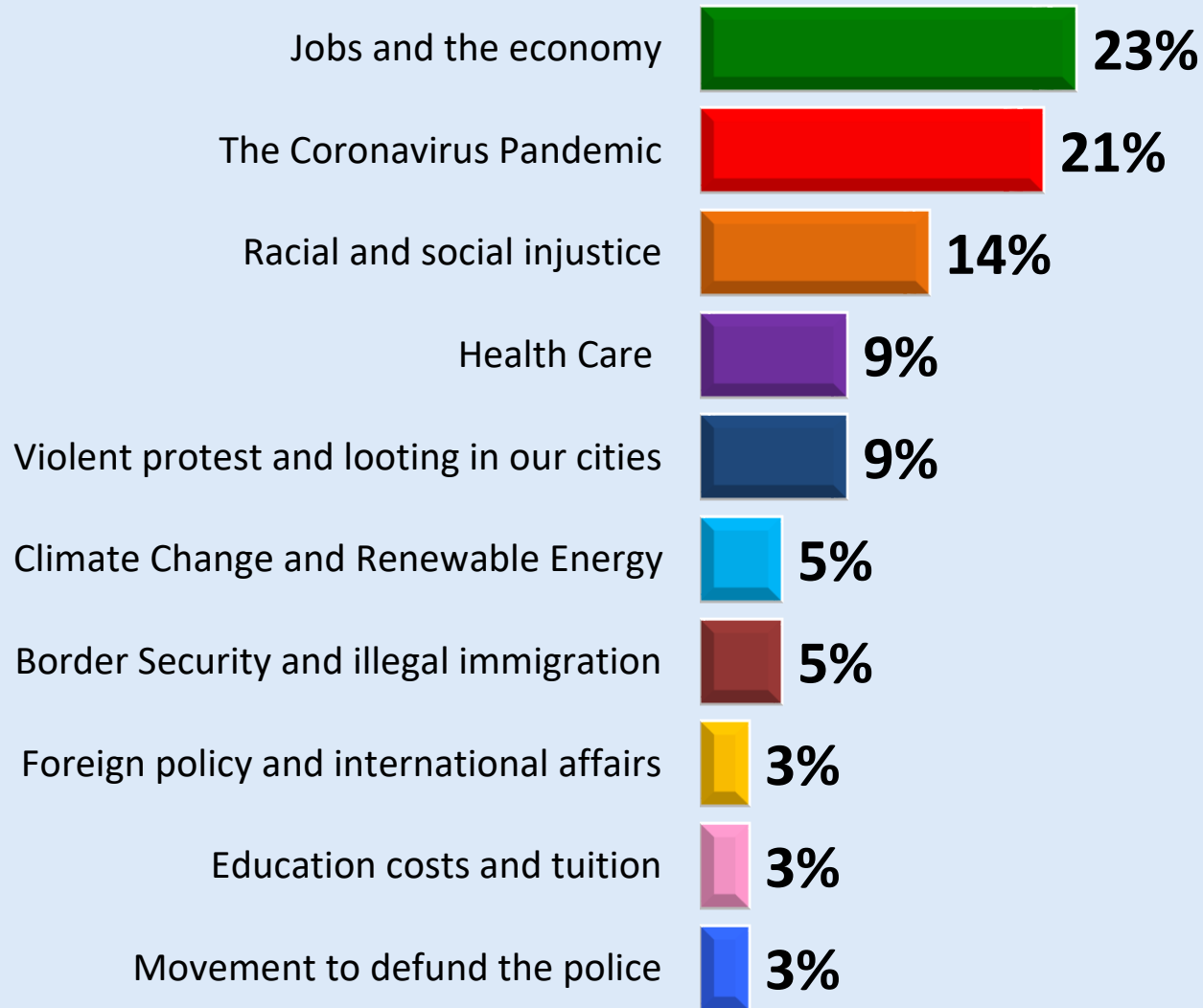

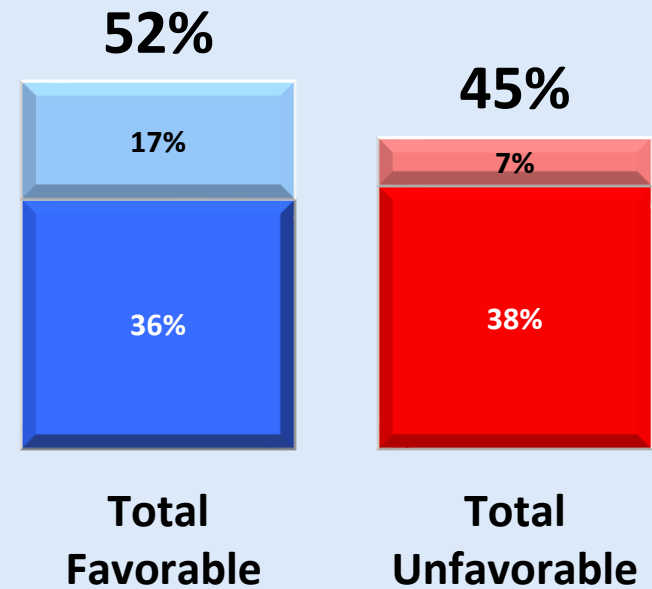
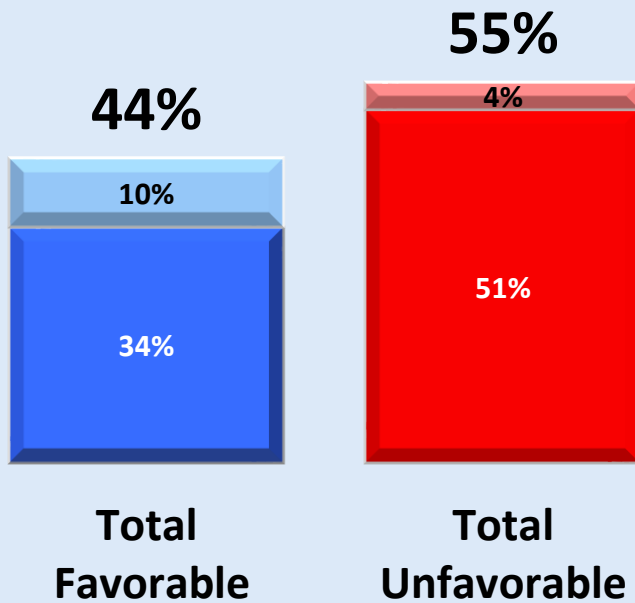

President Trump & Joe Biden Image



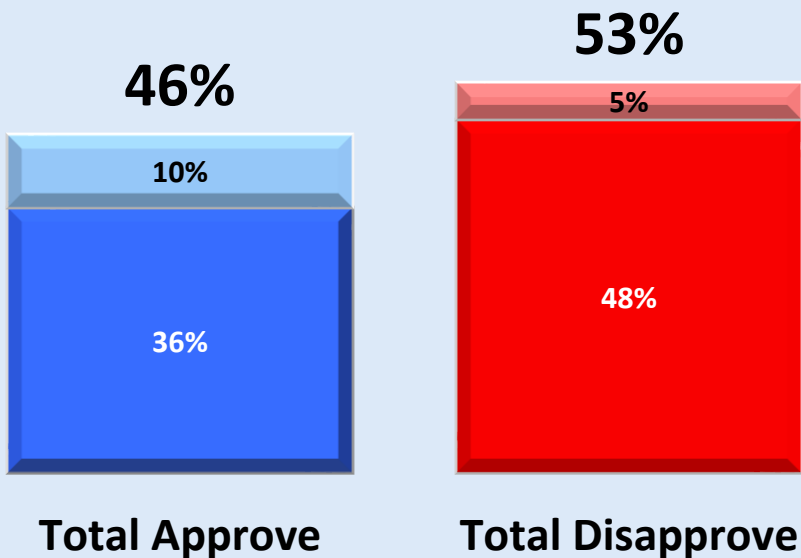

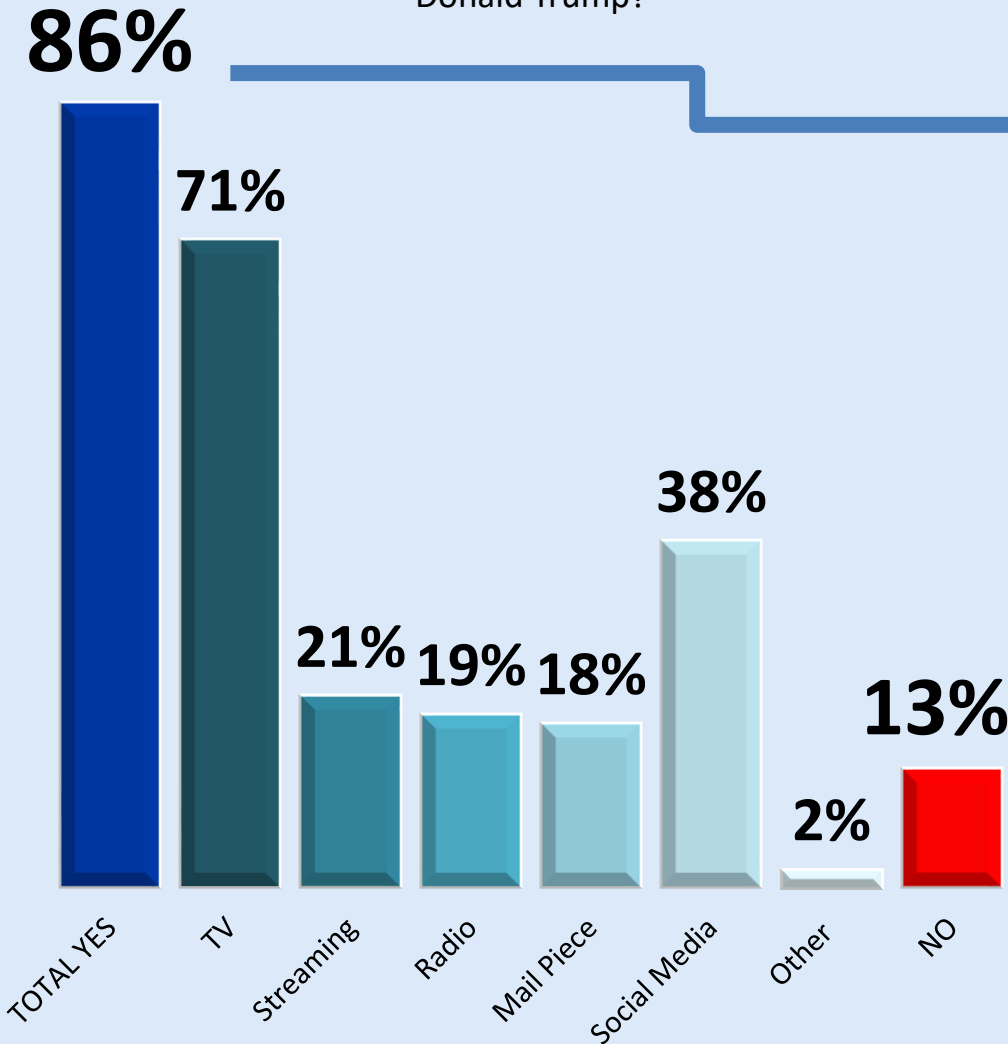

Addressing Surprise Medical Billing
